Every young talented athlete in the European Union should be able to benefit from both good quality education and sports training.

- > to ensure the reintegration of professional sportspersons into the labour market at the end of their sporting careers
- > to safeguard their moral educational and professional interests

White Paper on Sport (07/ 2007)





The main concerns on the career of talented young athletes:

- > The safeguarding of the development of young athletes;
- > The balance between sports training and education;
- The balance between sports training and employment;
- The end-of-career phase (including consideration of athletes who leave the system earlier than planned).

the development of young athletes

Factors of importance:

- > Age of beginning of intensive training in a particular sport
- Coach and sports programmes
- > Arrangements with educational institutes
- Other athletes' services



Interruption of general education

Factors of importance:

- > Characteristics of competitions
- > The age at which intensive training starts
- > Economy of the sport:
- > Lack of educational services trainings centres



Special measures taken by Member States and Sport

- Maximum on duration of training
- > Opportunities for young athletes with a disability



Actions European Commission

- ➤ European Council's Declaration on Sport
- ➤ EU Working Group on Education and Training in Sport.
- ➤ EU Sport forum
- > Financial support for dual training projects.
- > Future EU Sport Programme





Implementation of the Action Plan "Pierre de Coubertin"

Education and training

- Need to develop flexible systems for combining high level sports and academic education for young athletes.
- Need for legal and political frameworks to be adapted to reach the requested level (e.g. education laws on exams, length of subsidised education period, post career facilities, adapted curriculum)
- ➤ The new EU Working Group "Education and Training in sport" to facilitate exchange of experiences and good practises between Member States.





Implementation of the Action Plan "Pierre de Coubertin"

Education and training

- ➤ New EU Working Group on Education and Training in Sport.
- > First meeting of the Working Group in Brussels on 1 July 2009.
- Participants: Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Hungary, The Netherlands, Poland, Slovakia, United Kingdom.





Preparatory Action 2009

- Providing policy support for the identification of future policy actions in the area of sport through studies, surveys, conferences and seminars
- Testing the establishment and functioning of suitable networks and good practices through <u>call for proposals</u>
- Budgetary line voted by European parliament: 7,5 millions Euros

Sport

Future Sportsprogramme (Lisbon Treaty)

- > Formal framework for political cooperation
- ➤ Possibility for incentive measures

PREPARATORY ACTIONS (2)

- ➤ The specific nature of sport
- ➤ International dimension:
 - ■EU to speak with one voice
 - Cooperation international organisations
- ➤ Better mainstreaming of sport in other EU policies







Recommendations on Dual Careers (optional)

- Improve the legal and financial framework for dual careers;
- Improve the level of quality control, medical support and personal development;
- Promote the dialogue between sports and education sector and governments in order to develop systems for combining high-level sports training and academic education;
- Clarify the role of local and national governments and the European Commission in terms of how they could solve or help solve some of the challenges young talented athletes face;
- Involve athletes in this process.
